# Ohio Administrative Code <br> Rule 3339-10-01 Attendance and absence of students. 

Effective: October 17, 2019

Every student is expected to participate inacademically related activities and attend every class session for which thestudent is duly registered.

It is the prerogative of the individual facultymember to set attendance policy for each individual course, and it is theresponsibility of individual faculty to inform students in the course syllabusor other written document at the first class meeting of the semester, term, orsprint part of semester or term.

There are no university-recognized excused absencesexcept for religious observances that require absence from a class session andother required class activities (see list of religious holidays). For a fullsemester or term course, students must give written notification to theirinstructor within the first two weeks of class of the religious event whichprohibits class attendance and the date that will be missed if officiallyknown. Students enrolled in sprint or part-of-term courses must give writtennotification to their instructor within the first week of class. Instructorswill, without prejudice, provide such students with reasonable accommodationsfor completing missed work. However, students are ultimately responsible formaterial covered in class, regardless of whether the student is absent orpresent.

Faculty are required to excuse a studentsabsence due to pregnancy or related conditions, including recovery fromchildbirth for as long as the students doctor deems the absences to benecessary. When the student returns to classes the student must be provided theopportunity to make up any work missed. Alternatives include allowing thestudent to take an incomplete and complete the course at a later date, orretaking the course or taking an online course. The universitysenate also recognizes the need for flexibility when childcare responsibilitiesimpact a student and urge instructors to accomodate students with childcareresponsibilities.

It is the sense of the university senate thatfaculty, student groups and organizations, and the
university athletic coachingstaff are sensitive to the academic needs of students and the need for studentsto comply with the attendance policies in their respective courses. In general,class absence should be avoided unless absolutely necessary. If a student isinvolved in activities that result in class absence (such as intercollegiateathletics, band, debate, other class activities, etc.), it is thestudents responsibility to negotiate specific arrangements withindividual instructors about any absences.

The senate also recognizes the fundamental value ofextra- and co-curricular activities and their significance in thestudents overall educational experience. Instructors should recognizethat participation in such activities is an integral part of studentseducation and helps to fulfill the comprehensive mission of the university.Therefore, instructors are urged to accommodate students who participate inextra- and co-curricular activities as far as may be compatible with academicrequirements.

Whenever a student is absent from class to such anextent as to make the students work insufficient or to impair the moraleof the class, the instructor may direct the office of the university registrarto drop the student. During the first twenty per cent of the course no gradewill be recorded; after the first twenty per cent is completed but before sixtyper cent of the course is completed, a grade of W will be recorded. After sixtyper cent of the course is completed, a grade of F will be recorded. Theinstructor shall notify the student of this action no later than the time he orshe notifies the office of the university registrar. (See academiccalendar)

A department instructor may, at its discretion,drop from a course any student who is absent from the first class meeting of asemester term or sprint part of semester or term unless the student notifiesthe department or instructor by the end of the day (eleven fifty-nine p.m.) ofthe first class meeting of his or her intention to take the course. Whenpossible, departments and instructors should reinstate a student who, forreasons beyond his or her control, was unable to contact the department orinstructor by this deadline.

The determination of individual class attendancerequirements and their enforcement at the European center is governed by theattendance policy of the center.
