

Ohio Administrative Code Rule 3357:15-13-18 ODHE-Approved One-Year Certificate and Other Certificate(s).

Effective: June 7, 2021

A student becomes eligible for an Ohio departmentof higher education (ODHE) one-year certificate or other certificate(s) whenthe student has completed all the requirements of the program that the studentis enrolled in based upon the catalog-in-force and change of major policy (rule3357:15-13-28 of the Administrative Code) and as defined by the ODHE. Studentsmust also have a grade point average (GPA) of 2.00 or above in their technicalcourses(s) and a cumulative GPA of 2.00 or above. A maximum of fifteen semesterhours of credit transferred from other institutions in accordance witharticulation and transfer policy (rule 3357:15-13-25 of the AdministrativeCode) may be used toward the completion of an ODHE one-year certificate atStark state college. Coursework over ten years old is subject to review andacceptance by the chair of the department offering the course or the dean ofthat division. However, Stark state college will consider granting permissionto a certificate completer under a catalog more than ten years old if thecandidate has been enrolled continuously and the certificate program has notchanged appreciably. Students must complete at least three credit hours atStark state college to receive a career enhancement certificate.
