

Ohio Revised Code

Section 3301.0717 Establishment and submission of education goals with specific timetables by board.

Effective: September 11, 2001

Legislation: Senate Bill 1 - 124th General Assembly

In addition to the duties imposed on it by law, the state board of education shall establish and submit to the governor and the general assembly a clear and measurable set of goals with specific timetables for their achievement. The goals shall be established for programs designed to accomplish:

- (A) A reduction in rates of retention in grade;
- (B) Reductions in the need for remedial courses;
- (C) Reductions in the student dropout rate;
- (D) Improvements in scores on standardized tests;
- (E) Increases in satisfactory completion of high school achievement tests;
- (F) Increases in American college test scores;
- (G) Increases in the rate of college entry;
- (H) Reductions in the need for remedial courses for first-year college students.

In July of each odd-numbered year, the state board of education shall submit a report on progress made toward these goals to the governor and the general assembly.
