## Ohio Administrative Code Rule 173-13-04 Confidentiality statutes and rules. Effective: October 1, 2020

The following statutes and rules make personalinformation maintained by ODA confidential:

Section 111.43 of the Revised Code for not treatingaddresses of participants in the safe at home program as public records.

Section 149.43 of the Revised Code for the generalstatute on public records.

Section 173.061 of the Revised Code for recordsthat identify recipients of golden buckeye cards.

Section 173.22 of the Revised Code; and 42 U.S.C.3027(a)(12)(C), 42 U.S.C. 3058g(a)(5)(D), 42 U.S.C. 3058d(a)(6)(C), 42 U.S.C.3058g(d), and 42 U.S.C. 3058i(e)(2); 45 C.F.R. 1321.11, for the collection, compilation, analysis, and dissemination of information by the office of the state long-term care ombudsman program.

Sections 173.27, 173.38, and 173.381 of the RevisedCode for criminal records.

Division (B) of section 173.393 of the Revised Codefor records obtained while monitoring certified providers.

Division (H) of section 1347.15 of the Revised Codefor records in personal information systems.

Chapter 3798. of the Revised Code and 42 U.S.C.1320d et. seq.; 45 C.F.R. parts 160, 162, and 164 for individually-identifiablehealth information (HIPAA).

42 U.S.C. 1396a(a)(7); 42 C.F.R. 431.300 to431.307; and rule 5160-1-32 of the Administrative Code for information onmedicaid applicants and recipients.

42 C.F.R. 460.112(f) for individually identifiablehealth information of participants who are enrolled



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in PACE.
